Full Moon Rituals for Rapid Transformation and Renewal

For millennia, fire ceremony has been a powerful vehicle for burning away obstacles, honoring the divine, and manifesting wishes and desires. The Santa Fe Harmony Center is pleased to offer monthly fire ceremonies at the full moon, a traditional time for ritual when the veils between the worlds are the thinnest.

Fire ceremonies promote healing on all levels of being. Through fire ceremony, we honor our lessons and old belief structures by placing them into the fire and releasing them to Spirit.

The fire ceremony is an alchemical process that transforms offerings and prayers into light. It provides opportunities to translate intentions for healing into reality, and to bring new dreams into being.

First time attendees will learn how to conduct a sacred fire ceremony, the purpose and use of "spirit arrow" offerings, and the practice of using friendly fire to cleanse power centers in the body. Return participants will join newcomers for a guided, shamanic journey, and to practice a specific chant for the evening.

The evening will culminate in experiencing the power of the fire ceremony, complete with drums, rattles and chanting. *Come join us for this sacred practice of release and renewal.*
